President's Remarks 2023



Pastor Ian Grant

It has been my pleasure to serve the 119 churches of our Association in the year that has gone by. When I was asked to chair the Churches' Council in November 2022, I had the privilege of welcoming in three new churches on that occasion: Belturbet, Keady and Passage West. Sadly, during my tenure as President, the Orangefield Church in East Belfast closed, but we had the joy of seeing the Banbridge Church re-join our Association of churches. We now have three more churches seeking membership

from the Republic of Ireland. I wonder can we break through the '120 barrier' for the first time this year?

Since I took up the role of Vice-president in May 2022, I have had the pleasure of making 60 visits to our churches for one reason or another. I have visited 44 churches at least once. I have enjoyed 14 visits to southern churches this year. Jamestown Road holds the record. I was there 4 times, and once in their daughter church - North City Baptist Church. What a joy it was to meet just over 20 adults and about half a dozen children, from many different backgrounds, worshipping the Lord together in Ashtown. A prime example of the 'church-planting' I took as my theme throughout the year!

Sadly, three pastors: Bert Caldwell, Stephen Murphy and Ted Kelly passed away this year. A generation of faithful servants is going to glory ahead of us, but we should be thankful for a new generation of faithful pastors and church-planters coming after us, as I attended eight induction services this year! I also want to acknowledge Rob Millar's retirement from Jamestown Road after 35 years of faithful ministry, and all of Rob's faithful service to our Association.

It was wonderful to enjoy fellowship with 120 pastors at our conference in Carlingford in March with Mark Dever (Washington D.C.) as our speaker. Looking around the room, God is evidently blessing us by raising up good men.

I have chaired many committee meetings and three Churches' Council meetings (Nov 22, May 23, and Nov 23). It is encouraging to report a very healthy

financial position with record levels of church giving and personal giving to the departments! Even though this was the highest annual budget we have ever set, the Lord continues to meet all our needs! We must use these resources wisely as faithful stewards of these record sums of money.

Dave Ramsey and the team at the Baptist Centre do a tremendous job of overseeing the work of our Association. The regular work of Baptist Missions, Baptist Youth and Baptist Women is impressive, and is surely being used by God to bless many.

We have seen developments in the Irish Baptist College with a new Principal in Dr Jonny McClaughlin, and a new part-time Academic Administrator in Deborah McClaughlin. In Baptist Youth we have a new Director in Andrew McAuley, and we now have a part-time Media Co-ordinator in Matthew Campbell. Baptist Missions has just appointed a new part-time Project Administrator in Tracy Ellison, whose job it will be to write about the Centenary of the Irish Baptist Foreign Mission (founded in 1924) and to reflect on 100 years of Irish Baptist missionaries working in Peru as we approach the year 2027.

I would like to wish Edwin Ewart God's richest blessings as he takes up the role of President from May 2024 onwards. As he lays aside the work of College Principal at the end of August, he will hopefully have plenty of time to visit and minister God's Word in many churches in his presidential year.

In summary, we are in a very healthy financial situation. Most of our churches are in a healthy state too. Unlike many other denominations we have a good supply of relatively young pastors, and we have relatively few vacant churches that are actively seeking a new pastor at the present time. Mission is strong among us, and church-planting within our ranks has been exemplary!

As I have brought greetings in many of our churches this year, I have often stated that there are no two Irish Baptist churches which are identical to each other, but there is one thing that unites us: we still preach the same Gospel! We must continue to make sure that is in fact true, and not criticise one another when we differ on minor details. We must be united in our core doctrines and allow liberty of conscience in minor areas of difference.

President's Profile 2024



Pastor Edwin Ewart

My link to Irish Baptists dates to the 1970's when I began to attend the Magherafelt Baptist Youth Fellowship. I had come to faith in Christ in the local Gospel Hall, but developing friendships with lads who shared an interest in football and rugby, led me inexorably to the Baptists. As is so often the way, Baptist convictions came later!

The arrival of Pastor J. A. Smyth and family to the Magherafelt Church in 1975 was key to my spiritual development. His solid expository preaching and warm pastoral care was hugely influential on me as a young Christian, as was the weekly Bible class led by David Hamill. In the next few years, I began to teach Sunday School, became a leader in the Youth Fellowship and was elected a deacon. After school days, I went to the Ulster Polytechnic at Jordanstown where I trained in Social Work and became very involved in the Christian Union, serving on the CU committee and also on the National Colleges Committee of the UCCF in England.

At Jordanstown I met my wife, Alicen who was training in Physiotherapy. We were married in 1983 and God has blessed us with three children, David, Alan and Laura and four grandchildren. At Jordanstown, I had begun to sense the call of God on my life to go into ministry. I had begun to preach occasionally in my home church and also accompanied a music group to bring epilogues at evangelistic meetings in various places. This sense of call was confirmed by the leadership of the church and so having worked in social services in Carrickfergus for a few years, I entered the Irish Baptist College in 1983 to train for ministry. This was followed by pastorates in Letterkenny, Mountpottinger and Coleraine before the Lord led me to the College in 2007 as Assistant Principal to Dr Hamilton Moore and then Principal from 2010.

The Lord has sustained and encouraged me in the past 38 years in Christian service through the support of my wife, great Christian friends, faithful church members, and latterly, tremendous colleagues in IBC.

I look forward to serving the churches of our Association as President and hope to visit as many as possible over my term of office. Alicen and I are also hoping to encourage pastors and their wives during the year, in the vital work to which God has called them.

Churches

The total number of churches in membership of the Association at the end of 2023 was 119 (2022, 119). It was a great delight and joy to welcome and renew fellowship with the Banbridge Church as they were welcomed back into membership in November. Sadly, the Orangefield Church closed at the end of September 2023. We give thanks to God for the faithful work and witness of this church for over 80 years. It is also encouraging to report that a number of churches have opened up discussion with the Association regarding membership.

In 1991 there were 101 churches in the Association. Over the period to 2023 we have added 31 churches balanced by ten dissolutions and three resignations. In Northern Ireland there are 87 Churches. In 1991 there were 91. This reflects eight additions and twelve subtractions (resignation or closure). In the Republic of Ireland there were 10 churches in 1991 in comparison to 32 at the end of the year. This reflects 23 new churches and one closure.

Statistics

Members

It is encouraging to see a significant increase in membership across the churches during 2023 for the second year running. Total membership has increased by 357 from 8,276 to 8,633 (4.3%). Even accounting for the additions of Banbridge with

membership of 125 the increase in membership is significant. It is encouraging to see a steady decline in numbers over recent years being arrested. This is the third highest reported year end membership only 26 short of the high of 8,659 recorded in 2013. However, it is very encouraging to note that the total added to membership during the year is the highest ever recorded for one year.

A closer investigation of the year-on-year movement by individual church shows that 55 (2022 – 61) churches (46%) experienced an increase in membership with 41 churches (34%) experiencing an decrease in membership. 23 churches membership remained the same. Given the large increase in membership and the spread of movements in churches it would appear that increase are weighted towards a small number of churches experiencing a large increase in membership.

Attendance

The figure recorded for Sunday attendance is 12,786 (2022 – 11,445). The marked fall in attendance during COVID is being recovered with figures almost back to pre-pandemic levels. It is an encouragement to know that COVID has not had a noticeable impact on attendance.

Baptism

The figures for baptisms during the year is very encouraging with 335 (2022 – 262) individuals going through the waters of baptism. This is an encouraging sign that the levels experienced during COVID are being recovered. This is the second highest number of baptisms in a year since the year 2000. There is the possibility that this higher figure is a catch-up from the covid years. However, we trust that this is the result of an advance of the gospel and many individuals coming to faith.

Children and Young People

The number of children in children's meetings and young people attending our churches has experienced a very encouraging increase. The figure for children attending our programmes is the highest it has been for many years. The trend for young people has experienced a steady increase over the past few years. Both of these figures should be an encouragement and we need to continue to work hard at investment in these areas to ensure the continued growth of our family of churches.

Church leadership

The macro trend of the last 30 years of increasing elders in our churches would indicate that churches are placing a greater value on a plurality of elders providing spiritual oversight and servant leadership within our churches. An increase in eldership would suggest that churches may be in a stronger and more stable position. It is encouraging to see a third year of increase in numbers of elders in our churches. It is further encouraging to also see a second increase in numbers of deacons in this past year. Churches need to have intentionality in developing leaders and passing on experience to faithful men who will teach others.

There were six resignations from the pastorate and three retirements during 2023. There was one pastor who moved church during the year. A very encouraging sign that emerged this year is the number of appointments. Five inductions as pastor, and six inductions to other pastoral ministry roles within churches. This is a net movement of two additional ministry positions.

At the end of the year there were 29 (2022 – 28) vacant churches. This is an increase of 1 from the previous year but is still below the 36 recorded at the end of 2018. Developing pastoral oversight for our churches needs to be a high priority for all our churches.

Baptist Aid

Zimbabwe continues to experience economic difficulties. The Baptist Union of Zimbabwe are seeking to demonstrate Christian love and compassion through its Orphan Care Programme. ABCI are delighted to be able to contribute to this project. However, we have reached a stage where we can only support at the level of donations received into the fund. This comes from a number of committed monthly donations but mainly through the Christmas appeal. During 2023 we were able to support approximately 100 children in the programme. Churches are urged to continue to keep the profile of this endeavour high in the minds of their members.

Retired Ministers' Support Fund

The RMS fund continues to provide a small income for pastor and missionaries that have served our churches. The Fund currently supports 24 members with 502 years of service. However it has now entered the final stages of its existence and expenditure should continue to fall in coming years. Income needs to be sustained at current levels for at least five years to meet current commitments and ensure the deficit is removed.

Churches' Pastoral Support Scheme (CPSS)

The CPSS supported 7 churches to the total sum of £34,300 during 2023. It was pleasing to know that the income level to this fund allowed 100% of the committed grants to be paid. The fund has had one new application during 2023 and giving to the fund needs to be maintained to ensure adequate support is giving to all churches in the Scheme. The CPSS remains a Scheme which in one of its incarnations over the last 100 years has provided support for the majority of our churches. The history of many large churches today will show they survived in their early years because of such support. This fund is a practical expression of the larger churches assisting smaller and weaker churches so that they might move forward and take new ground.

Pastors' Conference

Well over 100 pastors, missionaries and youth workers attended the annual pastors conference in Carlingford, Co Louth in March 2023. This was a record number of attendees for the conference.

The guest speaker was Pastor Juan Sanchez from High Pointe Baptist Church in Austin Texas. Juan has a specific interest in training pastors and elders. Juan spoke on themes from the letter to the Ephesians. Session 1 – “Praising God for the blessings of our union with Christ”, Session 2 – “Praying for Spiritual Strength to comprehend Christ’s love for us” and Session 3 – “Standing firm against the devil in the strength of the Lord”. Juan is a pastor at heart and all in attendance appreciated his pastoral warmth and love for the local church.

Some of the most precious times at the conference are those spent in prayer or in small groups. This gives the pastors opportunity to discuss the challenges and privileges of ministry and to encourage one another. Those who attended went away refreshed and already looking forward to and planning for next year.

As a mission we look to the Lord and his people to pray, provide for our financial needs and send us people to continue this great work.

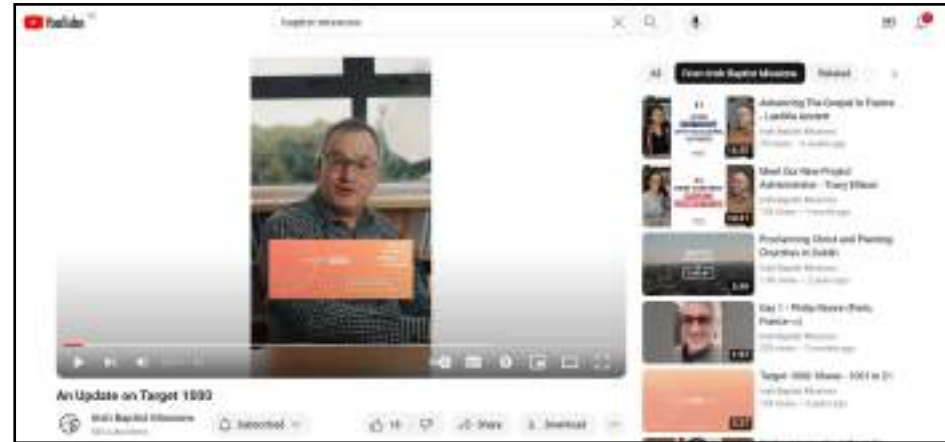
Beginning with Prayer

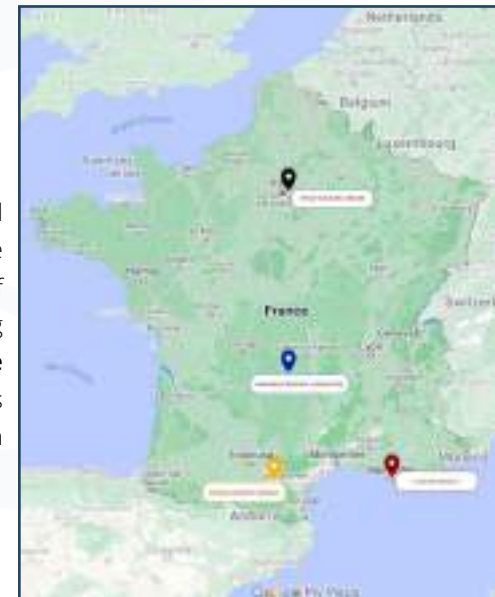
Four Fields

FRANCE

Last year **David and Hannah Sandall** moved from Égletons in central France to the town of Bram (17 miles west of Carcassonne) to work toward planting a church. **Philip and Rachel Moore** also moved from the outskirts of Paris to a more central location – again with a view to planting a church.

IRELAND



In Ireland, where most of our workers are located, 2023 was a year of consolidation, new appointments, significant milestones, and change.

Consolidation

The work in Passage West, Co. Cork, continues to thrive. **Peter and Payton Carrigan** (church-planting interns) entered into their second year of learning alongside

Paul and Kate McFarland are encouraged by the commencement of a new Bible study in the village of Lismore in Co. New Beginnings

Validation with Spurgeon's College

In the 2022 annual report it was noted that the University of Chester decided to conclude the validation agreement with the College. After a huge amount of work from the staff team, the College was delighted to sign a new validation agreement with Spurgeon's College, London in June 2023. This agreement ensured the ongoing training of the College's existing students and a new intake in September 2023 at a higher education level. Seven Ministry Partnership Scheme participants completed their placements in 2023, while four new participants entered the scheme: Timothy Houston (Dundonald), Joshua Patterson (Ballycraig Congregational), Graham Dougan (Armagh) and Matthew Patterson (Portadown). Twenty-one graduates of the College have been supported by the Ministry Partnership Scheme since its inception in 2014, with five further graduates currently in it.

Ten Year Vision

The Vision, launched in 2017, is continuing to reflect the positive outcomes for graduates of the College. By the end of 2023 59 graduates had been placed in ministry contexts since 2017. The aim is to see 70 placed by 2027, and by God's grace the College is hopeful of seeing this target exceeded by then.

Gospel Partnership

Davy Ellison, the Director of Training, joined up with the Baptist Missions Peru Team in late July/early August. While in Peru he preached in various churches and delivered a week of lectures in the seminary in Tacna which formed one module on the Christian Education Diploma accredited by the College. IBHS

In 2023 the Irish Baptist Historical Society hosted three lectures. In March Pastor Leslie Hutchinson delivered a lecture on the life and ministry of Pastor H. H. Orr. Director of Training's Postscript

The work of the College continues apace. It is not, however, without its challenges. Reflecting on 2023 two challenges in particular stand out. First, there is an increasingly significant administrative burden necessary in order to operate in the higher education sector. Larger institutions can absorb this more easily, for smaller institutions like the College this is much more difficult. The addition of a new member of staff to help shoulder this burden has been a great help, since it appears this will continue to be a challenge in the future. The College must remain undistracted from its main purpose: preparing people for ministry. Second, recruitment has been a challenge since the pandemic in 2020. This is a universal issue for theological colleges. Some Christian leaders have described it as a crisis of calling. Is God really calling fewer people into ministry? Or are more simply resisting the call? There is no easy answer here, except prayer. In the face of both these challenges the Association must stand firm with the College family in prayer for his help.

Finance Report

Executive Summary

- The year end position is once again encouraging and finishing in surplus for the fifth year in a row.
- Increased support has offset higher costs this year.
- Giving from churches was at a level of £803,473, the highest ever level.
- Personal giving was at a level of £417,417, also the highest ever level.

We give thanks to God for the growing levels of church and personal support, which demonstrates a strong commitment to working together and provides a platform for our Association of churches to move forward and develop this vital gospel ministry.

Accounts and Audit

A full set of statutory accounts have been prepared for the Association which are available on request. Included in this report are the Statement of Financial Activities and Balance sheet as reported in the statutory accounts and an additional summary of departmental accounts.

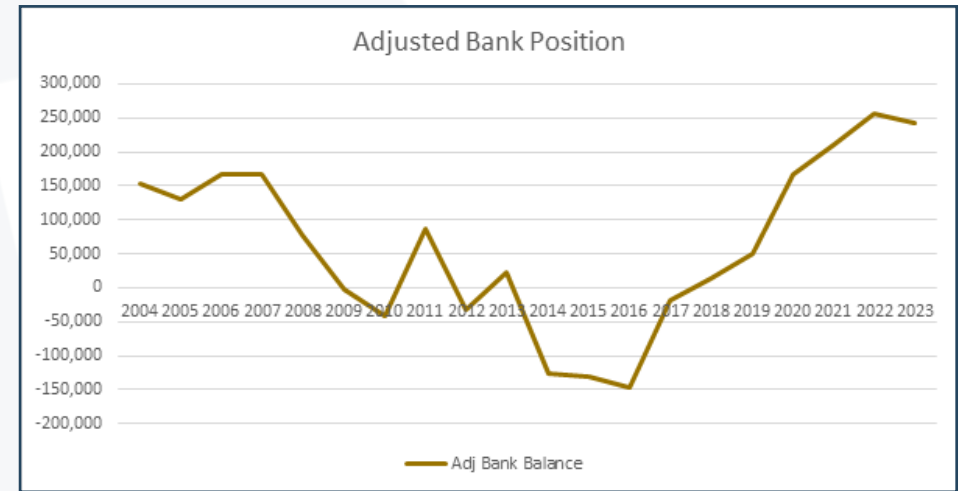
A full independent audit of the statutory accounts is being carried out by GMCG Belfast, Chartered Accountants.

Year-end Balance

An examination of the Statement of Financial Activities and Balance Sheet on page 25 will show that the Association budgeted departments recorded a surplus of £22,326 over the year, while the non-budgeted departments added an additional £55,731 surplus, resulting in an overall surplus of £78,057 for the year ended 31 January 2024.

The bank balance at the end of the year fell by £8,085 to £420,001 (2022; £428,087). The final £30,000 of Interest Free Loans from churches were repaid during the year. £177,770 of cash are held for the PIP fund. If these two factors are taken into account and the bank balance is adjusted, there is a surplus cash balance of £242,232. This is a drop of £15,284 from the position in January 2023.

The bank balance adjusted in this way at the year-end over a period of years is highlighted in the following graph.



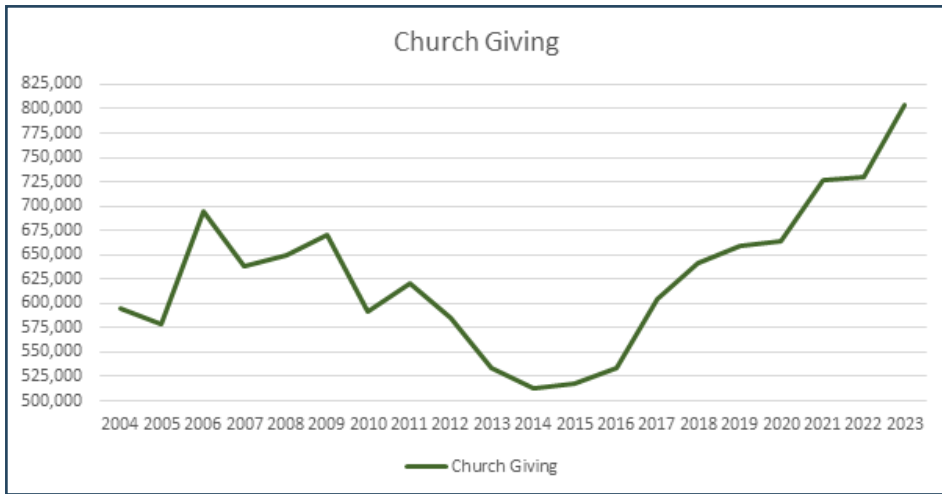
The elimination of the historical deficit is largely thanks to Church giving to the work of the Association, which has increased in each of the last 7 years. Personal giving has also experienced a significant increase.

Closing unrestricted reserves of £387,185 represents just under 3 months expenditure for the Association. It is good practice to hold at least 3 months expenditure in reserve. This provides a stable financial base to plan for the work of the Association in future years, with much of these funds already designated to support future work.

The encouraging financial position is evidence that the work of the Association in furthering a Baptist witness in Ireland is held in high regard by our churches and members. We return thanks to God for his faithfulness and goodness.

Church Giving

Church giving in 2023 was at a level of £803,473, an increase of almost 10% on the previous year of £730,548. This is the ninth consecutive year of growth in church giving to the work of the Association and the highest ever level. This is a significant increase in the level of giving by churches and we are thankful to God for this provision. The graph below highlights church giving to the Association over a 19-year period.



Church Donations Analysis

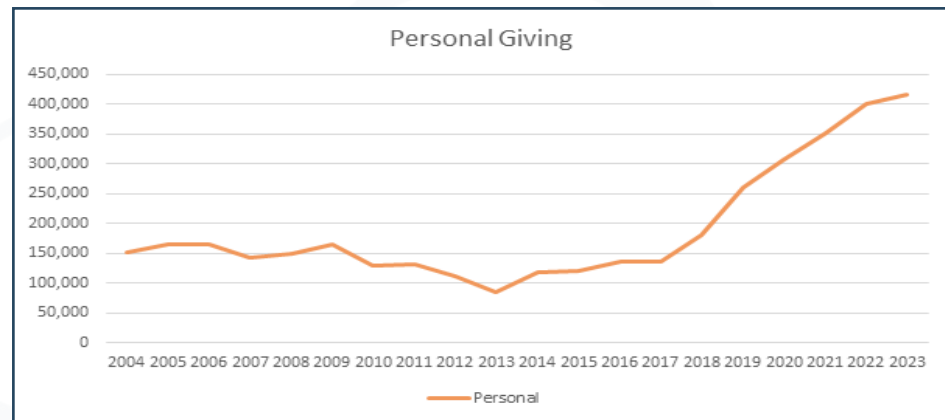
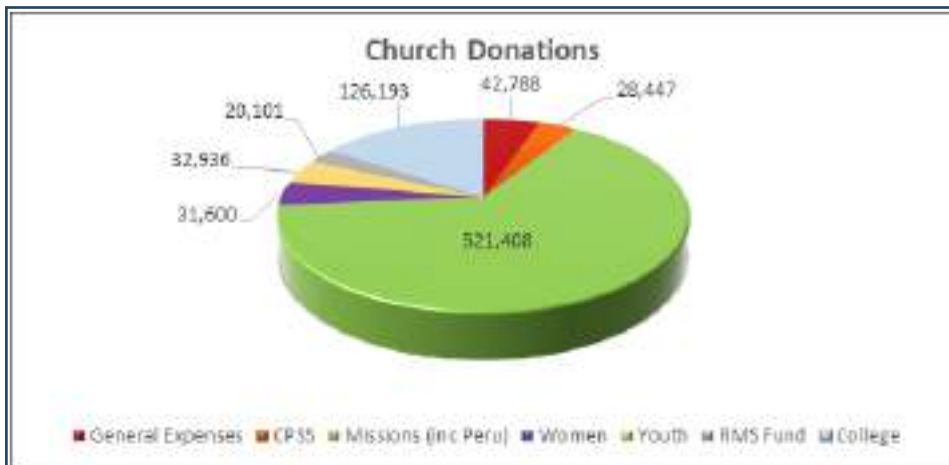
The Donations Analysis on pages 27-31 shows that out of 120 churches 106 gave something to the work of the Association. 63 churches increased their giving to the Association, 45 decreased their giving with 14 churches giving no financial support. It is once again clear that there are a significant number of churches that have examined their giving to the Association over the past year and have demonstrated their support of the work that we endeavour to do together by increasing their financial support. It is understandable that due to financial pressures some churches have been unable to provide financial support for the work of the Association, however these churches are encouraged to give a nominal amount to each department as an expression of their support.

Personal Donations

Personal donations to the work of the Association increased by £16,634 from £400,783 in 2022 to £417,417 in 2023.

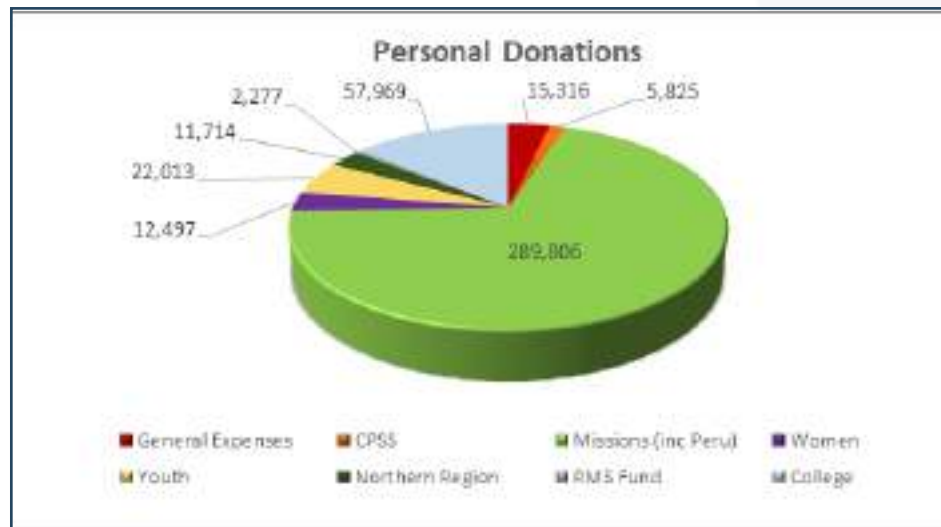
It is encouraging to see the continuing increase in personal donations and the highest ever level of personal donations to the Association. A large portion of this increase comes as a result of regular monthly giving, which demonstrates the personal commitment of many of our supporters. The College's Gospel Guardian campaign and Baptist Mission's Target 1000 campaign provide essential support as these departments continue in their work of the Gospel. Thanks is given to all the individuals who support the work of the Association in this manner.

We are very grateful for the generous and faithful support of the churches. This level of giving has significantly exceeded the budget target of £724,865. This level of giving has enabled the Association to ensure that expenditure in the year is covered by income. As in previous years most church giving has been designated to the support of Baptist Missions (£521,408), followed by the College (£126,193).



As with church giving, most personal donations have been towards Missions and College.

If giving from churches can remain at the level experienced in 2023 we will meet our budget target for 2024 and will provide the solid platform to enable the work of the Association to continue to move forward.



ABCI 2013 Retirement Benefits Scheme

The triennial actuarial valuation carried out on the Scheme at 31 March 2022 showed a funding deficit of £338,000 in the Scheme. Since this valuation the funding position has improved significantly, and the current investment strategy is expected to safeguard against further volatility in the financial markets. The Trustee Directors are currently pursuing the possibility of an insurance company buy-out of the scheme which would remove any risk the scheme presents to the Association, while also providing added security for the members of the pension scheme. The deficit will continue to be met by funding contributions from Association of £30,000 p.a. until June 2027 and is recorded as a liability of the Association on the Balance Sheet.

Thanks must be given to the Directors of ABCI Retirement Benefits Limited which acts as Trustee of the Scheme.

PIP Fund

Churches are continuing to respond positively to the PIP fund subscription. It is planned that this Fund will remain in place until the final member of the Scheme passes away. Contributions are estimated to be payable by churches until 2055. However, it should be noted that the real cost of contributions will not increase and will in fact decrease over time based on the current funding model. The balance on the fund at the year-end is £437,440 with over £250,000 held and invested by the Northern Baptist Corporation Limited on behalf of the Association.

Budget 2024

The Recommended Stipend Scale for 2024 was released to churches with a 5.0% increase for NI churches and 2.9% for ROI. It is for individual churches to assess the level of increase payable in their situation. The Finance Committee approved an increase to Association salaries of 5.0%. The total budgeted expenditure for 2024 is set at £1,972,027. This is an increase of £252,514 on the previous year budget figure of £1,719,513. Church giving needs to reach a level of £771,350 in order to sustain the entirety of the work undertaken by the Association. Church giving exceeded this level in 2023.

Review of the Year

The budget departments collectively finished the year with a surplus balance. A review of each Department shows the complexity of the financial position in 2023.

General Expenses

The General Expense department provides various Administration and Ministry Support services to Association departments and churches. This department has continued to reduce its historical deficit balance, ending the year with a deficit of £37,687 (2022 - £39,702). Income exceeded expenditure in this account by £2,015. Annual subscriptions from churches were at a level of £88,383 (2022 - £80,570). Expenditure was £16,416 higher than in 2022, mainly due to budgeted increase in staff costs, and increased pension administration costs. This department funded £20,000 of Pension Administration Costs (2022 - £15,000). The total administration cost of this Pension Scheme is in the region of £34,000 per annum. The Northern Baptist Corporation Limited has committed to funding the balance in order to ease the burden of this liability on the Association.

Baptist Missions

This Department continues to report encouraging financial results. Expenditure increased by £48,477 to £901,910, which was £111,410 above budget. This increase reflects the department's response to changing circumstances, particularly a reorganisation of the work in Peru, and new mission opportunities such as the Peru Team and an expanded Mission Worker's Conference. Much of the cost of these new opportunities was covered by funds raised specifically to those projects. Generous support has seen income increase from by £57,180 to £903,944, resulting in an overall surplus of £2,034 for the year. Church giving increased by £48,619, although

personal giving fell by £4,218. It is encouraging to see such high levels of continued church giving and personal donations in support of missionaries and projects, demonstrating the value that our supporters are placing on the work we do as a gospel partnership of churches in Proclaiming Christ and Planting churches. The landscape across France, Ireland, Peru and Spain is so needy that there are many opportunities that need our support.

Baptist Women

The Women's department continues to hold a mix of in-person and online events throughout the year, encouraging participation by women across Ireland. Income exceeded expenditure by £2,277 resulting in a closing surplus for the department of £9,077. Church donations saw an increase of £473 to £31,600 while personal giving increased by £4,623 to £12,497. This closing surplus means Baptist Women is well placed to continue developing their ministry among the women of our churches.

Baptist Youth

The full program BYE Teams and Camps has continued this year. These activities, helped the department finish the year with a surplus of £2,034. The number of churches giving to this department fell by 3 from 55 to 52, although the total amount of giving increased by £1,941. Personal donations fell by £4,360. Despite the reduction in giving the successful summer program of camps and teams meant the department was able to meet all of its costs and return a small surplus. Given the importance to our churches of reaching the younger generation maintaining support at this level should be a priority.

Retired Ministers Support

It is encouraging that the historical deficit in this department has now been eliminated. This closing balance was a surplus of £339 (2022 - £5,113 deficit). This fund currently supports 24 members. It has now entered the final stages of its existence and expenditure should continue to fall in coming years.

College

The Irish Baptist College returned a deficit of £5,393 this year, resulting in a closing deficit position of £675. The financial impact of smaller student numbers continues to be felt, while this year saw a number of increased costs as a result of the transfer to Spurgeon's. With these additional financial pressures, the College had budgeted to finish the year with a deficit of £30k so it is encouraging to only be faced with a deficit

of £5k for the year. This is largely due to increases in both church (+£13,878) and personal (+£5,626) support. Church giving exceeded the budget target by £11,691 and the number of churches giving to support the work of the College increased from 60 to 70 during the year. Financial pressures remain a source of concern for forthcoming years, and churches are encouraged to support the College primarily by identifying and sending students with a calling and gifting for ministry to train at the College. Given the vital and strategic work of the College and the impact on our churches it is imperative that the college is given the support it requires as it seeks to prepare leaders for gospel ministry in pastoral and missionary settings.

Churches' Pastoral Support Scheme

It was encouraging to see continued support for the CPSS. The fund closed with a £1,367 surplus at the year end. The level of giving once again enabled 100 percent of the promised grants to be passed to the six churches currently in the Scheme. The impact on a small church of having someone in place to lead the work forward cannot be underestimated. Support of this fund is commended to the churches.

Insight Magazine

The Insight Magazine account continues to operate at a deficit of approximately £5,000 a year and looks to the Northern Baptist Corporation Limited for support. This is as a result of a slow decline in subscriptions as a result of the challenges that printed media face in a digital age. The magazine is one of the main channels of disseminating information from our churches and Association departments and requires support in promoting the magazine. The Editorial Committee believes that the magazine is an excellent product that deserves support.

Baptist Aid

Throughout 2023 we continued to support the vital work of the Baptist Union of Zimbabwe Orphan Care Programme. A surplus of support over costs of £2,517 has reduced this department's deficit to £1,415. Churches are encouraged to continue to support this life giving project.
